Miami-Dade County Department of Transportation and Public Works DOWNTOWN MIAMI MICROMOBILITY NETWORK

Project Description:

The Department of Transportation and Public Works of Miami Dade County (DTPW) in partnership with the City of Miami and the Downtown Development Authority (DDA) has started construction of separated bicycle/scooter lanes in downtown Miami. The project indicates a progressive County move towards safer streets and makes part of the effort to prioritize the implementation of the County's Vision Zero and Complete Streets Programs.

As part of this project, DTPW will be performing the following improvements:

- High visibility pedestrian crosswalks
- New ADA pedestrian ramps
- High visibility pedestrian signage
- Repair concrete sidewalk
- Repair manholes
- Build separated green bicycle lanes
- Milling, paving, and marking
- Installation of various separation elements (planters, armadillos, concrete stoppers, delineators, and others)





Aerial view of the Downtown Miami Micromobility Network








DTPW is constructing new separated bicycle lanes along:

- N Miami Ave Under Construction (to be completed by March 2022)
- NE 1 Ave Under Construction (to be completed by March 2022)
- N 5 St Under Construction (to be completed by March 2022)
- N 6 St Under Construction (to be completed by March 2022)
- NE 15 St Under Design (Accepting public input until October 2021)
- DTPW will also be adding separation devices to existing bicycle lanes along:
- Venetian Causeway Under Construction (to be completed by January 2022)
- S 1 St

Funding for this project has been obtained from various sources including:

- City of Miami Commission District 2 Micromobility Fees
- Downtown Development Authority Operating Fund
