Subject: Resolution Waiving Formal Bid Procedures

Agenda Item No. 8(O)(1)(B)

This package, listed as Agenda Item No. 3D on the December 11, 2007 Budget and Finance (B&F) Committee meeting agenda, was amended by the Committee to bifurcate Item 4.1 Elevator and Escalator Maintenance. Item 4.1 will be a stand-alone item on the February 12, 2008 B&F Committee agenda.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners waive competitive bidding procedures for the attached contracts to purchase goods and services pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Section 4.03(D) of the Home Rule Charter, in the best interest of Miami-Dade County.

Scope

The impact of the items in the accompanying Bid Waiver Package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The accompanying Bid Waiver Package states the funding source for each department utilizing a contract. It should be noted that no funds are to be expended on any contract if the department's budget cannot support such expenditures.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the accompanying Bid Waiver Package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the agenda item.

Background

Section 1 SOLE SOURCES

A sole source purchase is the procurement of a good or service under Administrative Order 3-38 for which there is no other vendor who can compete to provide the good or service, and an equal product or service is not available from any other supplier.

There are no items in this section.

Section 2 BID WAIVERS

A bid waiver is a purchase of a good or service under Administrative Order 3-38 without formal competitive bidding when it is determined to be in the best interest of the County.

Item 2.1: EMD Diesel Engine Generator is to award a contract to Engine Systems, Inc. to provide and deliver a diesel engine generator unit with extended warranty to the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department for the Alexander Orr Water Treatment Plant. The amount being requested is **\$2,305,882**.

Item 2.2: Load and Pack Vehicles and Front Loading Compactor Boxes is to award a contract to Broyhill Manufacturing for the purchase of two Load and Pack Refuse Vehicles, and 15 Front Loading Compactor Boxes for the Miami-Dade Park and Recreation Department. The amount being requested is **\$322,405**.

Section 3 EMERGENCY PURCHASES

An emergency purchase is an unforeseen or unanticipated urgent and immediate need for goods or services where the protection of life, health, safety or welfare of the community, or the preservation of public properties, would not be possible using other purchasing methods described in Administrative Order 3-38.

Item 3.1: Security Guard and Screening Personnel Services ratifies an emergency contract replacing a contract originally awarded under an emergency competition due to non-compliance with contractual requirements involving Living Wage and Performance Bond by Empirical Protective Services, Inc. The affected sector provides security guard and screening services for courts facilities managed by General Services Administration. The amount being requested is **\$1,731,630**.

Section 4 NON-COMPETITIVE CONTRACT MODIFICATIONS

A non-competitive contract modification is a supplemental allocation for goods or services that exceeds the scope of the original contract allocation, or a modification of an established non-competitive contract, representing a waiver of the competitive bidding process under Administrative Order 3-38.

Item 4.2: Janitorial Services is for additional spending authority to compensate for 2006 and 2007 Living Wage rate increases and the addition of eight facilities. This contract provides janitorial services for several buildings managed by General Services Administration. The additional amount being requested is **\$1,175,600**.

Section 5 CONFIRMATION (UNAUTHORIZED) PURCHASES

A confirmation purchase is a ratification action approving an unauthorized purchase in accordance with Administrative Order 3-38.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners waive formal bid procedures and approve the award of a contract to Engine Systems, Inc. to provide an Electro-Motive Diesel (EMD) engine generator with extended warranty to the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) for the Alexander Orr Water Treatment Plant.

Contract No: BW8507-0/11

Contract Title: EMD Diesel Engine Generator

Description: This contract will provide one diesel engine generator equipped with EMD engine controls, electronic unit injectors, and emissions certified for compliance with Federal Environmental Protection Agency regulations. The contract includes equipment, delivery and a two-year extended warranty.

JUSTIFICATION

The Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) currently has five Electro-Motive Diesel (EMD) engine-generators at the Alexander Orr Water Treatment Plant. The engine-generators are linked through an EMD master synchronization control system. In the event of a power outage, the control system is designed to start the engine-generators, in sequence, supplying power to pumping stations and maintaining water pressure. The timing and the synchronization of the engine-generator's start-up is crucial in maintaining the plant's water pressure. Loss of pressure would result in the contamination of treated water, and in potential fines by regulatory agencies.

A sixth engine-generator is required to accommodate the County's growing need for uninterrupted fresh water supply. This item is presented as a bid waiver because the purchase of engines other than EMD engine generators may lead to loss of synchronization with the existing EMD engine-generators and the main control system.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners waive formal bid procedures and approve the award of a contract to Broyhill Manufacturing to purchase two "Load and Pack" refuse vehicles and 15 front loading compactor boxes for the Miami-Dade Park and Recreation Department.

Contract Title: **Load and Pack Vehicles and Front Loading Compactor Boxes**

Description: This contract will provide two off-road load and pack vehicles and 15 front loading compactor boxes capable of picking up and dumping 55 to 90 gallon trash containers and larger seven-cubic yard front loading collection compactor boxes on various terrains. This equipment is used on County beaches by the Miami-Dade Park and Recreation Department, Beach Maintenance Division.

JUSTIFICATION

The Miami-Dade Park and Recreation Department has a fleet of three Load and Pack Refuse Collection Vehicles that are over 15 years old and have exceeded their useful life. These trucks are utilized to pick up garbage collection boxes on County beaches and parks. This award allows for replacement of two vehicles which have deteriorated due to extensive exposure to salt.

The Load and Pack vehicles are capable of picking up and transporting large refuse collection boxes and individual trash receptacles directly on County beaches. While there are other refuse trucks available in the market place, staff recommends a bid waiver because the Broyhill equipment enables the automation of collection and dumping by a single employee, replacing a manual process which requires a crew of six employees and two 4 x 4 dump trucks. The use of another type of equipment would be more costly to the County since it will require more personnel.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners to ratify an emergency award to Vanguard Security, Inc. to provide security guard and screening services for the courts (Sector 2A), managed by General Services Administration (GSA). The previous vendor, Empirical Protective Services, Inc., failed to comply with the contractual terms and conditions related to Performance Bond and Living Wage requirements, which resulted in the immediate termination of the vendor.

JUSTIFICATION

Seeking ratification of an emergency contract awarded to Vanguard Security, Inc. on November 19, 2007 to provide security guard and screening services for the courts (Sector 2A) that are managed by General Services Administration (GSA). The previous vendor, Empirical Protective Services, Inc., failed to comply with Performance Bond and Living Wage requirements, resulting in immediate termination of the vendor. Immediate action was required to maintain safety for the courts. Therefore, an emergency contract was awarded to Vanguard Security, Inc. the next lowest responsive, responsible bid for Sector 2A, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the solicitation approved by the Board on March 15, 2005.

The vendor originally awarded Sector 2A was Milex Corporation, Inc., was purchased by Empirical Protective Services, Inc. The transfer was accepted by the County on June 27, 2007.

This emergency contract is in place for this service pending the award of a replacement contract.

REASON FOR CHANGE

General Services Administration (GSA) is requesting a contract modification to increase the allocation for janitorial services contract to compensate for 2006 and 2007 Living Wage increases, and the addition of eight facilities during the initial contract term: South Dade Government Center Complex, Cutler Ridge Police Station, South Dade Justice Center, Fleet Manager, Shop 3D and Fleet Manager, Shop 1, Mosquito Control, Animal Services and Library.

On February 7, 2006, the Board approved a bid waiver to Respect of Florida to provide janitorial services to various GSA managed buildings. These services are covered by Florida Statue 413.036, which requires that agencies and political subdivisions in the State of Florida purchase certain services, including janitorial, from a qualified non-profit organization which employs blind or other disabled persons.

The Florida Association of Rehabilitative Facilities Inc. d/b/a Respect of Florida is a non-profit agency established to manage the employment of blind or other disabled persons by having government agencies purchase the services provided by these individuals.

RESOLUTION WAIVING FORMAL BID PROCEDURES FOR THE PURCHASE OF GOODS AND SERVICES AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO AWARD SAME, WITH AUTHORITY TO EXERCISE OPTIONS-TO-RENEW ESTABLISHED THEREUNDER

WHEREAS, the County Mayor recommends to this Board to waive formal bid procedures for the purchase of goods and services which cannot be purchased under normal bid procedures,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board finds it is in the best interest of Miami-Dade County to waive formal bid procedures for the purchase of goods and services and to authorize the County Mayor or his designee to award such contracts, with authority to exercise options-to-renew established thereunder pursuant to Section 4.03(D) of the Home Rule Charter and Section 2-8.1 of the County Code by a two-thirds (2/3s) vote of the Board members present.
