Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve this request for additional expenditure authority under *Contract No. FB-00628, Landfill Gas Management Systems,* for the Department of Solid Waste Management. Approval for increased expenditure authority in the amount of \$1,623,000 is needed to ensure continuity of services. The County awarded this contract on February 12, 2019 under the Mayor's delegated authority. Board approval of this item is required as the cumulative contract amount will exceed the Mayor's delegated authority.

Landfill gas management systems and services are necessary to fulfill the requirements of the County's Title V Air Permits, as well as mandatory greenhouse gas monitoring, related regulations, permits and contractual obligations to supply landfill gas services as fuel for electric energy production. These permits include provisions for compliance with the Federal Clean Air Act, which encompass the regulation of multiple elements of each specific emission source. Failure to comply with Title V permit requirements may result in significant penalties and fines.

The current gas collection system is in the process of being upgraded in order to comply with Title V Air Permit requirements. These upgrades are significant and include, but are not limited to, the addition of approximately 30 landfill gas extraction wells and flare stations at both the North Dade and South Dade landfills. The landfills currently have gas wells and associated piping that were installed approximately 20 years ago. These required upgrades, as well as the additional monitoring and maintenance for the new infrastructure were not contemplated when the Department solicited this contract in 2018. Solid Waste Management is requesting additional expenditure authority to continue procuring services for the operations, monitoring and maintenance of the upgraded gas collection system.

Approval of this modification is in the best interest of the County as it will allow the County to maintain its permit-sensitive program.

<u>Scope</u>

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The contract term expires on February 29, 2024. The contract has a current cumulative allocation of \$777,000. If this request is approved, the contract will have a modified cumulative allocation of \$2,400,000.
