
# City of North Miami Beautification Programs


### **Rehabilitation of Owner-Occupied Homes**

•Homeowners residing in the City of North Miami who do not have adequate financial resources to make necessary home repairs.

•Eligible activities includes: emergency repairs, weatherization, home rehabilitation and exterior painting to correct code violations.

Funded through CDBG, SHIP, and HOME program

•Since January 2006 a total of <u>41 homes</u> have been completed totaling an estimated amount of <u>\$2,050,000</u>



## **Multi-Family Rehabilitation**

•This is a new program with a primary purpose to increase the diversity of affordable housing units by rehabilitating deteriorated rental housing units occupied by low and moderate-income residents of the City.

•To achieve this purpose, the City will focus on rental housing units within the City limits of North Miami in accordance with the needs and priorities identified in its consolidated plan.


•CP & D will seek private participation by the use of Request for Funding Proposals (RFP) or Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA)


## Paint Program


•To beautify communities and satisfy potential or existing code violations. Limited to the unit exterior.

•An eligible participant will select their colors and submit them to the Building Department for approval, as they must be in compliance with the City's color chart.

•Since 2006 a total of <u>135 homes</u> have been painted totaling an estimated amount of <u>\$661,500</u>




#### **Roof Program**

•To replace the entire roof system that has outlived the "useful life" and/or has significant leakage.

•This strategy allows flat and shingle roof replacements.

•Since January-November 2006 <u>37 houses</u> have been completed totaling an estimated amount of <u>\$550,000</u>





#### **2005 Disaster Grant**

•The City of North Miami has acquired \$2.3 million CDBG funding for disaster relief from the 2005 hurricane season.

•The program will focus on the components such as roofs, windows, shutters, doors and in some cases, interior rehabilitation that will bring the unit up to current standards and codes.

•Since September 2007 a total of <u>44 homes</u> have been completed totaling an estimated amount of <u>\$977,000</u>





#### **Commercial Façade Program**

Funded by CDBG covers 50% of the approved project cost, up to \$40,000

Community Redevelopment Agency's Commercial Rehabilitation and Beautification Program

•Over \$2 million in investments has been targeted to the City's major commercial corridors:

NE 125<sup>th</sup> Street NW 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue West Dixie Highway NE 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue Biscayne Boulevard NW 119<sup>th</sup> Street Community Redevelopment Agency's Commercial Rehabilitation and Beautification Program

Commercial Rehabilitation program covers 50% of the approved project cost, up to \$80,000

Beautification program provides a grant of up to \$15,000 per project

Since its inception in July 2005, a total of 5 projects have been completed and 10 projects under construction totaling \$376,728
