# 2024 Miami-Dade County Commission District Profiles



#### **Note on Data Sources**

The following infographics and tables draw on three sources of data. The first is the 2022 American Community Survey (ACS) 5-Year Estimates based on approximately 3.5 million nationwide surveys annually conducted over the five-year period from 2018 to 2022. It was released in December of 2023 and represents the most current and comprehensive data source of its kind.

The second and third sources for the following data are the corresponding 2012 and 2017 American Community Survey (ACS) 5-year estimates, released in December of 2013 and 2018, respectively. The former covers the time period from 2008 to 2012, and the latter from 2013 to 2017. This provides non overlapping survey periods for comparison with the 2022 data.

For ease of reference, each of the estimates will be referred to by the final year of the reference period, 2022 data, 2017, data and 2012 data.

#### Note on Charts and Numbers

The following infographics contain three types of charts: charts with numbers, bar charts, and donut/ring charts. For ease of understanding the following conventions were used in the presentation of the data:

#### Charts with numbers:

Charts with numbers include population, households with kids, median household income, per capita income, the number of persons living in poverty, poverty rate, housing units, housing vacancy rate, median home value, median gross rent, unemployment rate, school enrollment, housing units with no vehicle, median travel time. In these charts, the green-color numbers represent 2022 data, the grey-color numbers represent 2017 data.

#### Bar charts:

Bar charts include population by age, employment status, employment by sector. In these charts, the green-color bars and numbers represent the 2022 data, the grey-color bars and numbers represent the 2017 data. For the bar chart for housing costs as percent of household income, each main color represents the level of cost burden with the darker-color bars representing 2022 data, and the lighter-color bars representing 2017 data. For the bar chart for means of transportation to work, each main color represents a means of transportation (car, transit, walked, etc.), with the darker-color bars representing 2022 data, which are at the bottom section of the chart, and the lighter-color bars representing 2017 data, which are at the top section of the chart.

#### **Donut/Ring Chart:**


Donut/ring charts include race and ethnicity, housing units in structure, owner and renter units, and educational attainment. In these charts, the outer ring with the darker color scheme represents 2022 data and the inner ring with the lighter color scheme represents 2017 data.


