

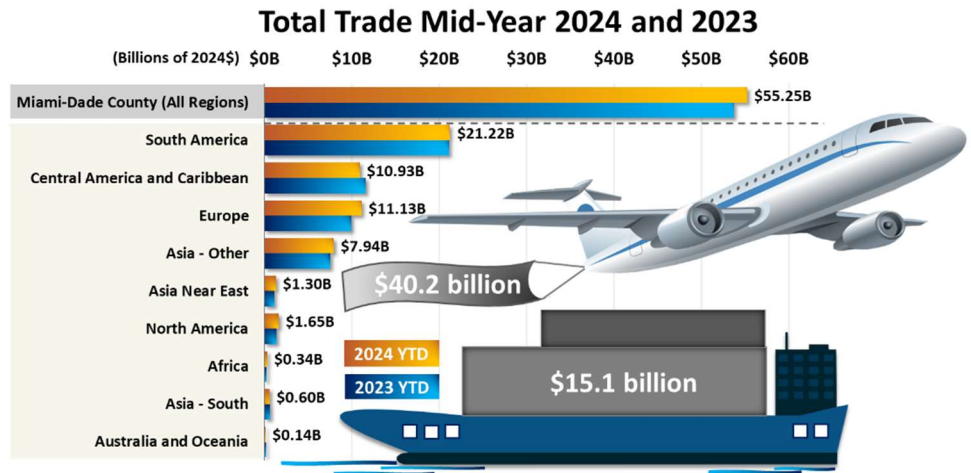
# INTERNATIONAL TRADE

Mid-Year 2024



## TRADE BY REGION\* (Billions of 2024\$)

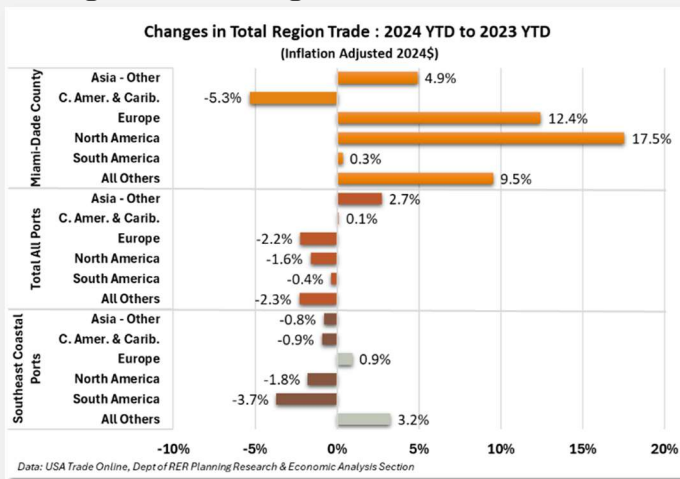
In Miami-Dade County (M-DC), international trade was up 29.2% in the first half of 2024, over the same time, since the pandemic in 2020 according to the Census Bureau’s USA Trade Online tool. The countywide trade value totaled \$55.3 billion, inflation adjusted, up 2.8% over the same time from 2023 year over year. Trade flowing through Miami International Airport (MIA) was up 7% to almost \$40.2 billion, while trade passing through PortMiami decreased 6.8% to \$15.1 billion from 2023 year over year. Exports made up more than one half of the total value, totaling \$29 billion, while imports made up 47.6% of the total value, accounting for \$26.3 billion.



Over the first half of 2024, trade with South America, the County’s largest trading partner, was up from \$21.1 billion a year ago to \$21.2 billion, representing an increase of 0.3%. International trade with Europe, the second largest trading partner, increased 12.4% to \$11.1 billion, while trade with the third largest trading partner, Central America and Caribbean, decreased 5.3% to \$10.9 billion.

Trade between M-DC and majority of the regions of the world experienced growth, except Asia-South, and Australia and Oceania, down 4.7% to \$599.3 million and 7.5% to nearly \$143.5 million, respectively. Trade with Asia-Other was up 4.9% to \$7.9 billion; North America was up 17.5% to nearly \$1.7 billion; Asia Near East was up 16.8% to \$1.3 billion; Asia-South was up 4.7% to \$599.3 million; and Africa was up 22% to \$336 million, over the same period.

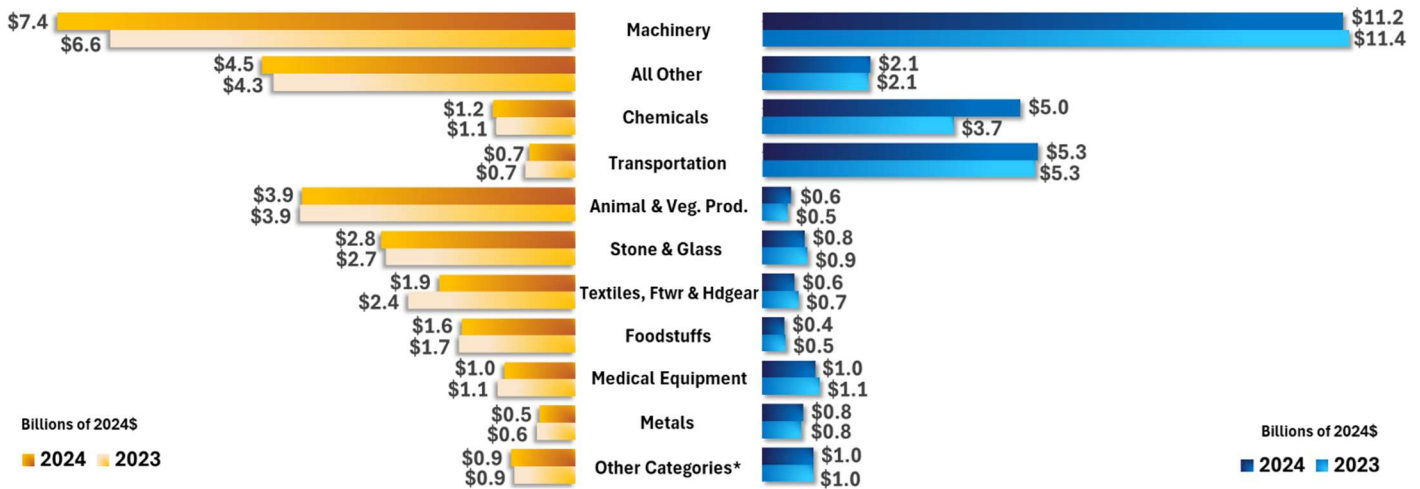

In total trade by region, M-DC outperformed the Total All U.S. Ports and Southeast Coastal Ports with respect to year-over-year changes, up 2.8% to \$55.3 billion. Trade flowing through All Ports decreased 0.4% to \$2,594.2 billion, while Southeast Coastal Port was down 0.3% to \$630.7 billion from 2023 year over year.

### IMPORTS

Imports by commodity flowing through PortMiami and MIA for the first half of 2024 was \$26.3 billion, up 1.4% the same time period from \$25.9 billion (in 2024\$) in 2023. The largest import category was machinery, up 11.4% to \$7.4 billion. The increase mostly occurred in parts for phone sets and other apparatus for transmission of voice, images or data, up from from \$1.5 billion to \$2.1 billion, representing an increase of 42.2% or \$626 million.

The second-largest category, all other miscellaneous, was up 3.9% to almost \$4.5 billion, while animal and vegetable products, the third-largest import category to the county, down 0.5% to \$3.9 billion.

The rest of the categories saw mixed results. Stone & glass increased 2.3% to \$2.8 billion. Textile, footwear and headgear was down 18.8% to \$1.9 billion. Foodstuffs was down 2.3% to \$1.6 billion; chemicals was up 4.5% to \$1.2 billion; and medical equipment was down 9.1% to \$1.0 billion. Other categories increased 5% to \$911.8 million.

### EXPORTS

The total value of export commodities from the county to the rest of the world was worth \$29 billion for the first half of 2024, up 4.1% the same time period from \$27.8 billion (in 2024\$) in 2023, up 4.1% over the same period from 2023. Chemicals led the way in the total value of exports, up 34.9% to \$5 billion. The primary driver of the increase was medicaments consisting of mixed and unmixed products for therapeutic or prophylactic uses, up 98.9% from \$1 billion to \$2.1 billion.

Transportation ranked second, up 1% with exports totaling \$5.3 billion. Chemicals ranked third was up 34.9% to nearly \$5 billion over the same time period. All other miscellaneous saw trade increased 1.6% to \$2.1 billion. The remaining categories saw mixed results.

Medical equipment decreased 6.6% from \$1.1 billion to \$1 billion. Other categories\* decreased 0.3% to nearly \$992.5 million. Stone & glass also decreased 6.1% to \$824.7 million. The drop was driven mainly by articles of jewelry, down 60% to \$187.4 million, and by gold, including plated with platinum, unwrought or in semimanufactured and powder forms, down 40.8% to nearly \$378.7 million.

Metal was up 4.1% to \$797.1 million. Textiles, footwear and headgear was down 10.2% to \$629.5 million. Animal and vegetable product was up 12.1% to \$561.4 million; and foodstuffs also dropped 4.3% to \$432.9 million.

### Balance of Trade

## TRADE BY WEIGHT

### Total

For the first half of 2024, total trade by weight flowing through Miami-Dade County saw a marginal increase of 0.01% to 4.5 million tons over the same time in the prior year. The county's total trade by weight recovered since the coronavirus pandemic, up 16.3% from the same period in 2020.

### Regions

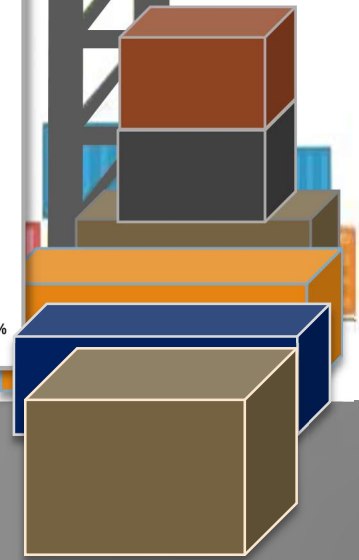
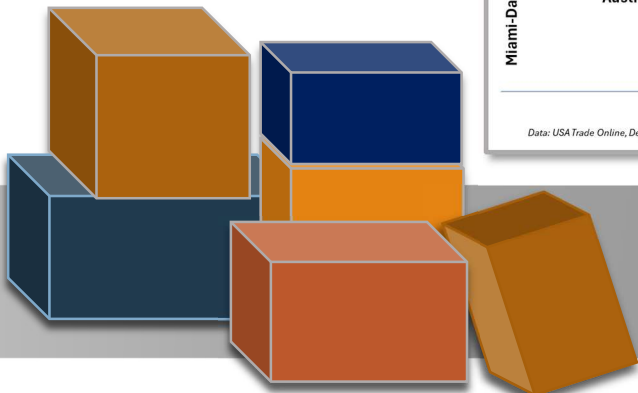
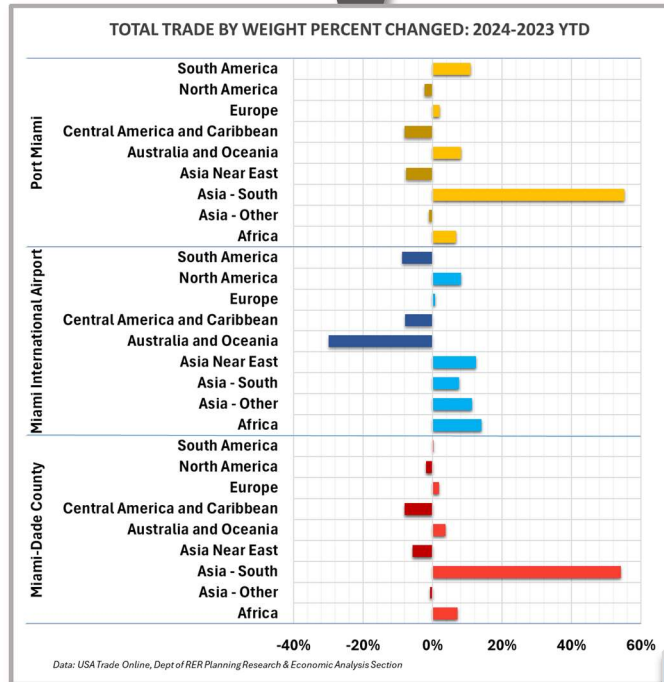
Countywide, trade by weight was largely dominated by shipments to and from Central America and Caribbean, South America, and Asia-Other. The largest trade volumes with Central America and Caribbean were down 8.1% to 1.1 million tons, surpassing the total tonnage of South America, up 0.3% to 1 million tons. Asia-Other also decreased 0.8% in total trade by tonnage to nearly 923 thousand tons, for the first six months in 2024, same time period from the prior year.

### PortMiami

At PortMiami, 2024 mid-year total tonnage increased 1.3% to nearly 3.9 million tons. Together, Central America and Caribbean, and Asia-Other, captured more than 50.8% of the total. Central America and Caribbean total tonnage by weight dropped 8.1% to 1.1 million tons, and Asia-Other decreased 1% to 900.8 thousand tons. Asia-South saw the largest increase in trade by tonnage, up 55.3% to 259.1 thousand tons.

### Miami International Airport

For MIA, trade by weight totaled 674.4 thousand tons, down 6.9% in the first half of 2024 from the prior year. South America made up 73.7% of all trade by weight via MIA, down 8.8% to 496.9 thousand tons. The total tonnage of Central America and Caribbean also decreased 7.9% to 80.4 thousand tons.

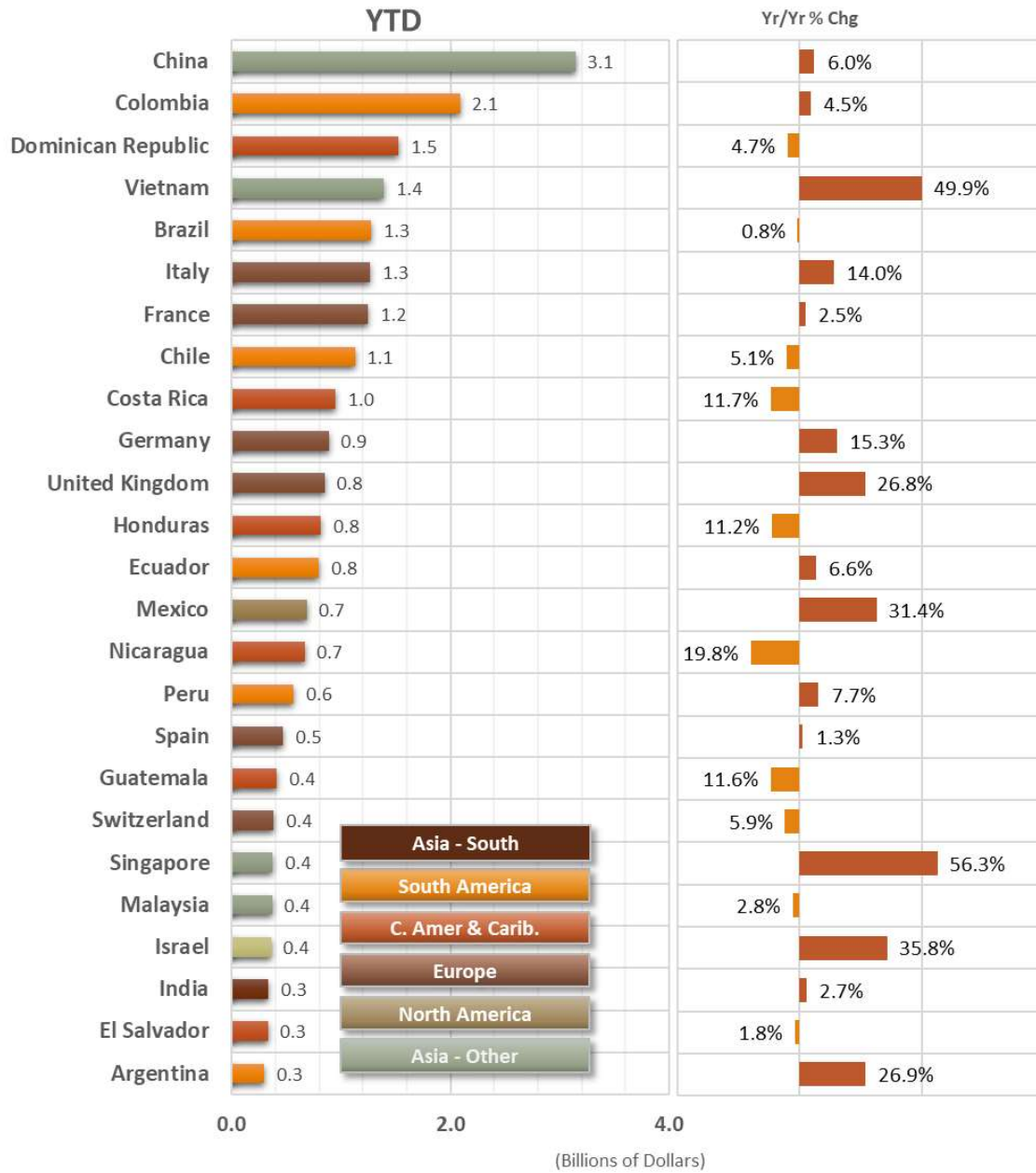

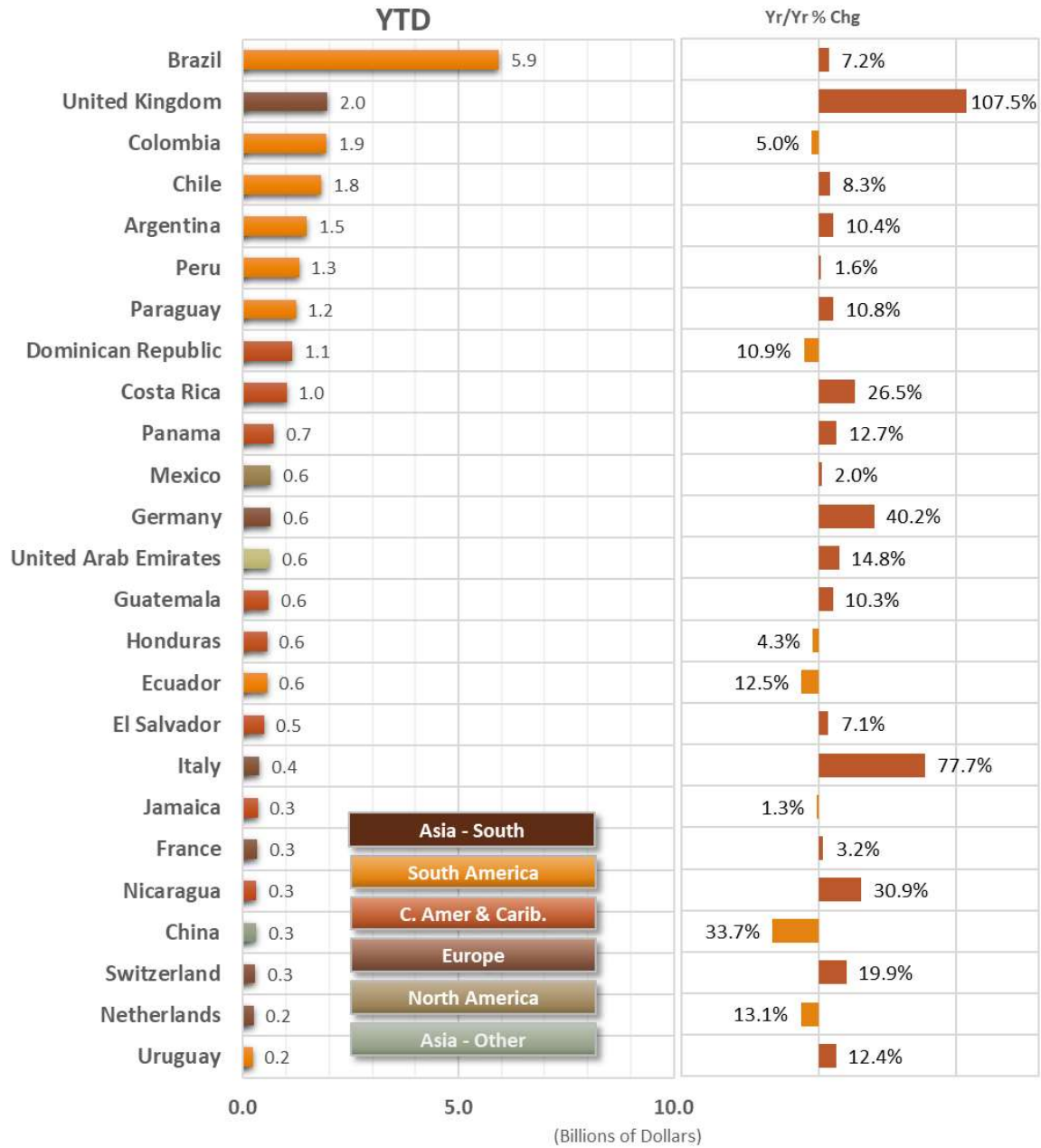
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### Top 25 Miami-Dade Import Partners: 2024

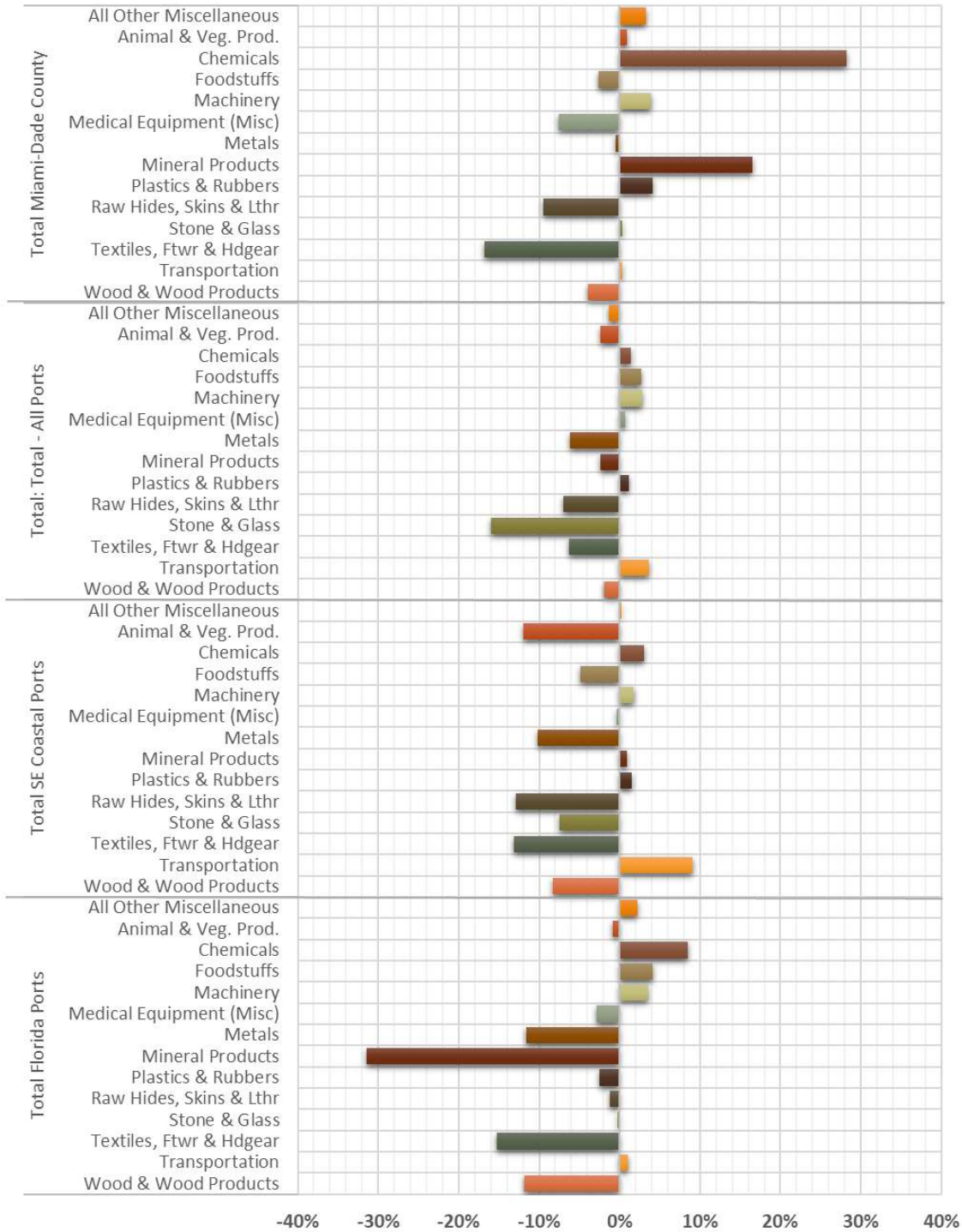
