Segment 1: Miami Extension

Extension of Metromover north along the median of North Miami Avenue

Segment 2: Bay Crossing / Trunkline

Elevated rubber tire technology (Automated People Mover or Monorail)

Segment 3: Miami Beach Extension

Dedicated bus/trolley lanes along Washington Avenue





Status Update


- TPO Governing Board Meeting on January 25, 2024
 - Unanimous approval for a re-evaluation of the project including commuter rail
- \$8.1M Project Development Grant from FTA
 - FTA confirmed the use of funds for LPA Update
 - Coordination between FDOT and DTPW on scope of work

Northeast Corridor


- First segment of the 85-mile Coastal Link commuter rail corridor connecting Miami-Dade with Broward and Palm Beach counties.
- New rapid transit route with five new stations between Downtown Miami and the City of Aventura.

Project Benefits

- New convenient rapid transit service option for over 100,000 residents.
- Reduces auto travel by nearly 8,000 trips per weekday, easing traffic congestion.
- Offers more reliable travel times, especially during peak traffic hours, compared to driving.
- Increases access to economic opportunity to over 65,000 lowincome residents.

Estimated Ridership

6.3 million trips per year in 2043



Major Milestones Achieved


- Received NEPA Approval from FTA: November 2023
- Risk Assessment Workshop: January/February 2024
- Received FTA Project Ratings to President's budget: March 2024
- Submitted Request to Enter Engineering: May 23, 2024
 - Expecting approval/completion of Project Development Phase of CIG/New Starts Program: September/October 2024
