Overview

This report is presented by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (also known as the Transportation Trust) with information pertaining to the oversight of the Charter County and Regional Transportation System Surtax Funds (Surtax) and implementation of the People's Transportation Plan (PTP) for the period October 1, 2023 – December 31, 2023.

The Transportation Trust works closely with members of the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners (BCC), Miami-Dade County's administration and staff, and municipal officials to ensure Surtax funds are properly invested in local transportation projects.

Transportation Trust Updates



Transportation Trust Meetings

The Transportation Trust meets on a regular basis to fulfill its statutory responsibility to "monitor, oversee, review, audit and investigate" the implementation of the People's Transportation Plan (PTP).

First Quarter:

During the First Quarter of FY 2023-24, the Full Trust met 3 times, and there were no committee meetings.

Municipal Presentations

There were two presentations: One done by Coral Gables and the other by North Miami Beach.





Resolutions and Contracts Approved by the Transportation Trust

A major responsibility of the Transportation Trust is to review items requesting Transportation Surtax funding for projects listed in the Five-Year Implementation Plan of the People's Transportation Plan (Five Year Plan). These contracts are initiated by the Miami-Dade Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTPW) and are reviewed by staff at the Office of the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (OCITT) before they are voted on by the Transportation Trust members. The following contracts were approved during FY 2023-24:

Resolution 23-023 – Resolution by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust to award Contract No. EVN0000308 to EXP US Services Inc. for Strategic Planning and Review Consulting Services for OCITT and authorize the use of Charter County Transportation Surtax Funds in an amount not to exceed \$2,500,000 for five years (CITT)

Resolution 23-024 – Resolution by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust recommending the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) authorize the execution of a construction agreement between Miami-Dade County, the State of Florida Department of Transportation, and the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority for the relocation of railroad crossing traffic control devices at NW 37th Avenue near NW 58th Street in the amount not to exceed \$534,768.34; authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute same and exercise all provisions contained therein; and authorize the use of People's Transportation Plan Bond Program funds (PTP) for such project which was in the original Exhibit 1 of the People's Transportation Plan (DTPW BCC Legislative File No. 232088)

Resolution 23-025 – Resolution by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust recommending the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) authorize the execution of a construction agreement between Miami-Dade County, the State of Florida Department of Transportation, and the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority for the relocation of railroad crossing traffic control devices at NW 37th avenue near NW 59th Street in the amount not to exceed \$534,768.34; authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute same and exercise all provisions contained therein; and authorize the use of People's Transportation Plan Bond Program funds (PTP) for such project which was in the original Exhibit 1 of the People's Transportation Plan (DTPW BCC Legislative File No. 232089)

Resolution 23-026 – Resolution by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust recommending the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) approve the award of the project titled Car Cleaner Platform Replacement Project Request for Price Quotation (RPQ) No. 412223 R1 between Miami-Dade County and Epic Consultants, Inc. in the amount not to exceed \$5,860,829.70, inclusive of a contingency allowance of





\$532,802.70 for a 730-day term; authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute same and exercise the provisions contained therein; and authorize the use of People's Transportation Plan Bond Program funds for this project which was added to the Five-Year Implementation Plan in October 2019 (DTPW BCC Legislative File No. 232098)

Resolution 23-027 – Resolution by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust recommending the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) approve Supplemental Agreement No. 1 to Professional Services Agreements (PSA) to provide Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI) services for various DTPW projects, Project No. E17-DTPW-03, Contract No. CIP190-DTPW17-CEI, increasing the contract amount by \$2,000,000.00 and time by one calendar year (365 days); authorize the use of People's Transportation Plan Bond Program funds for this purpose; and authorize the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee to execute same and to exercise the rights contained therein (DTPW - BCC Legislative File No. 232102)

Resolution 23-028 – Resolution by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust recommending the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) approve award of Contract No. EVN0000506 to Danobat, Inc. for the purchase of an underfloor rail vehicle wheel truing machine for the Department of Transportation and Public Works in an amount not to exceed \$2,378,143.00 for a ten-year term; authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to give notice of this award to the recommended vendor, issue the appropriate purchase orders to give effect to same and exercise all provisions of the contract, including any cancellation or extensions, pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida and Implementing Order 3-38; pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Transportation Surtax Funds for this project which was added to People's Transportation Plan 2018-23 Five-Year Implementation Plan in March 2018 (DTPW/SPD BCC Legislative File No. 231860)

Resolution 23-029 – Resolution by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust recommending the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) delegate contracting authority to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award, access, and modify competitively solicited contracts to purchase mobile equipment and other light and heavy fleet vehicles in an amount not to exceed \$11,645,366.40 for the Department of Transportation and Public Works for fiscal year 2023-24, subject to ratification by the Board on an annual basis; authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise all provisions of any contracts awarded, accessed, or modified pursuant to this delegation, including any cancellation, renewal and extension provisions; and authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to give notice of any award, issue the appropriate purchase order to give effect to same and exercise all provisions of any such contracts pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the Code and Implementing Order 3-38; and authorize the use of Charter County Transportation Surtax Funds in the amount of \$6,162,000.00 included in the FY24 adopted Budget (DTPW/SPD BCC Legislative File No. 232135)

Resolution 23-030 – Resolution by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust recommending the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) authorize a designated





purchase pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b)(3) of the County Code by a two-thirds vote of the Board Members present; authorize modification of Contract No. RFP-01966 in an amount not to exceed \$15,938,574.49 for the purchase of charging infrastructure equipment and associated services for the Department of Transportation and Public Works; authorize the use of \$15,938,574.49 of Charter County Transportation Surtax Funds for this project which was added to the Five-Year Implementation Plan in 2020, and authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute Supplemental Agreement No. 1 to Contract No. RFP-01966 for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County and to exercise all provisions thereof pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida and Implementing Order 3-38 (DTPW BCC Legislative File No. 232252)

Resolution 23-031 – Resolution by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) recommending to the Board of County Commissioners (BCC), the approval of the FY 2024-28 update of the Five-Year Implementation Plan of the People's Transportation Plan (PTP)

Major Highway and Road Improvement Projects

The Miami-Dade Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTPW) is also responsible for implementing the Surtax funded roadway improvements listed in the Five-Year Implementation Plan of the People's Transportation Plan.

Neighborhood Improvement Projects

DTPW continues to coordinate the Neighborhood Improvement Projects with County Commissioners' offices. Improvements in this category include roadway resurfacing, sidewalks, ADA ramps and connectors, drainage, guardrails, striping, traffic signals, and traffic calming.



DTPW takes advantage of contracting mechanisms, such as the County's Miscellaneous Construction Contract (MCC) Program to accelerate

implementation of projects. It is an open competitive process which allows for expedited procurement. The MCC program provides contractors countywide with a fair opportunity to compete for work on County construction projects and has a direct beneficial impact to the County by accelerating construction projects.

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) and Small Business Participation Reporting

The Transportation Trust monitors and reports on the level of participation by small and disadvantaged businesses in contracts receiving transportation surtax funds. It is supported in this effort by the Department of Transportation and Public Works's Office of Civil Rights and the Miami-Dade Internal Services Department (ISD) Small Business Development Division. The federal Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program encourages the development and use of companies owned and controlled by minorities, women, and socially and economically disadvantaged individuals on federally-aided projects.

The County's small business program tracks contracts awarded with Surtax funding and subject to local small business goals, wages, and Community Workforce requirements. The following activity is reported during the quarter.

PTP Municipal Update

Approximately 23 percent (23%) of Surtax proceeds are allocated to 33 municipalities eligible to receive People's Transportation Plan (PTP) funds. Each city receives a pro rata share of funds based on population which are used to develop or enhance the city's public transit and transportation systems. Twenty-three (23) municipalities provide bus shuttle service to 25 cities funded by the Surtax. The municipal shuttles jointly transported 2,512,690 passengers on fixed route services during the first quarter of Fiscal Year 2023-24, excluding data from the Town of Cutler Bay.

The cumulative numbers presented above are as of 12/31/2023 for FY 2024. The "Unspent/Cash Balance" includes Recaptured, Capital Expansion Reserves and/or Unrestricted funds, some of which will be distributed in the future in the appropriate categories. Please note that Surtax transfers/distributions may not always occur in the month Surtax revenue is received.

The cash balance includes \$57,881,189 recaptured from municipalities in non-compliance being held for redistribution to the remaining municipalities; \$6,514,429 being kept in a reserve account for future capital expansion and \$323,488,686 in unrestricted funds.
