Resolution Requesting Authority to Exercise Option-to-Renew Periods Under Existing Competitively Bid Contracts that Would Bring the Cumulative Contract

Value to More than \$1 Million

<u>Recommendation</u>

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners delegate to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee the authority to exercise, in their discretion, the Options-to-Renew (OTRs) set forth in this item. Ordinance #07-139 provides for committee review exemption. Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on estimated past usage. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County departments and/or agencies.

#### **Scope**

The impact of the item in the accompanying OTR package is countywide in nature.

#### Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures approved in their Resource Allocation Plan adopted annually by the Board. There is no additional fiscal impact beyond what is stated on the individual items in this package. Allocations have been rounded consistent with standard auditing practices.

#### Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the accompanying agenda item. The departments' contract managers are reflected in the accompanying agenda item.

#### **Delegated Authority**

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise OTRs in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contracts listed in the accompanying package.

#### **Background**

The competitively bid contracts listed in this item requires approval to exercise OTRs contained in the contracts that would, if exercised, bring the cumulative value of the contracts over \$1 million. These contracts were awarded under the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee's delegated authority (\$1 million for competitive procurements) pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b) of the County Code and the Master Procurement Administrative Order, A.O. 3-38.

The contracts in this package were awarded prior to the effective date of Ordinance 09-52 which requires obtaining Board authorization to award contracts where the renewal options would bring

the cumulative value of the contract above \$1 million.

Prior to exercising any Options-to-Renew (OTR) periods, market research is conducted to ensure that continuing to purchase from the awarded vendors is in the best interest of the County. Market research includes competitive factors such as pricing, quality, product features, technology, and lead time. It may also include commercial factors such as environmental issues, other governmental entity practices, industry trends, support and capabilities. The OTRs for each contract in this package will be executed if determined to be in the best interest of the County.

Item No. 1: Specialized Flat Tire Repair Services seeks authority to exercise the two remaining OTR terms to purchase specialized tire repair services for various County departments. The amount being requested for the remaining option terms is \$478,000.

Item No. 2: Financial Advisory Services for the General Segment seeks authority to exercise the remaining OTR term for financial advisory services. The amount being requested for the remaining option term is \$567,000.

Item No. 3: Financial Advisory Services for the Enterprise Segment seeks authority to exercise the remaining OTR term for financial advisory services. The amount being requested for the remaining option term is \$567,000.

Item No. 4: Landscaping and Lawn Maintenance Services seeks authority to exercise the remaining OTR term to purchase landscaping and lawn maintenance services for Internal Services and the Port of Miami. The amount being requested for the remaining option term is \$209,000.

Item No. 5: Towing Services (County) seeks authority to exercise the three remaining OTR terms for towing services for various County Departments. The amount being requested for the remaining option terms is \$2,187,000.

#### **JUSTIFICATION**

Cumulative Value:

This contract is for purchase of specialized tire repair services performed at County facilities, and for road service. Services are provided for County-owned cars, trucks, vans, utility vehicles, golf carts, off-road equipment, buses, and mover vehicles.

Staff conducted market research to evaluate industry prices, other agency contract prices, and changes in the Consumer Price Index. Results indicate the County's contract pricing remains competitive. It is in the best interest of the County to exercise the two remaining options-to-renew for continuity of services.

**JUSTIFICATION** 

This contract is used by Internal Services and the Port of Miami for general landscaping services. The services include mowing; tree, palm, hedge and shrub pruning; flower bed care; cleaning of sidewalks; and weed and litter control.

The services provided by the awarded vendors are covered by the Living Wage Ordinance. Vendors will receive the most recent adjustment of 0.88% based on the December 2010 Consumers Price Index (All Urban Consumers - Miami-Ft. Lauderdale). The allocation for the next term has increased to accommodate this adjustment. Vendors are also responsible for providing resources including equipment and fuel. While the price of fuel has increased over 25%, vendors may not request a price adjustment per contract's terms. It is in the best interest of the County to exercise the final option to renew.

This contract provides towing services for County-owned vehicles and equipment. The solicitation included services for eight geographical zones, and then subdivided these into groups based on the size and weight of vehicles. Vendors are awarded as primary, secondary, tertiary, and quaternary vendors by zone, and group.

Market research has shown that the County's pricing is competitive when compared to the prices paid by other jurisdictions in the South Florida area. These towing services are needed to ensure safe and smooth transport of County-owned vehicles. It is therefore in the best interest of the County to exercise these options to renew.

## Performance/Compliance Data:

Kauff's of Miami, Inc.: During this contract's second option-to-renew period, the County discovered errors with invoicing. This firm overcharged the County on two occasions for towing services. The vendor agreed to cancel the incorrect invoices and issued new invoices with correct amounts.

The following performance issues involve vendors awarded a contract under RFQ97, Police Towing and which are recommended for this contract. These issues have been successfully closed out or corrected.

#### Westbrook Motors, Inc.

While conducting a site inspection due to the sale of the company, the Miami-Dade Police Department discovered that Westbrook did not have



sufficient inside storage space to comply with requirements of the County contract. Westbrook had an agreement with the City of Hialeah that required the same amount of inside storage spaces as the County contract. The City of Hialeah relinquished Westbrook from their agreement after the new owners agreed that the inside storage space was to be used solely by Miami-Dade County.

#### Kauff's of Miami, Inc.

MDPD issued a warning to the vendor for several violations including overcharging citizens \$13.50 in towing charges per citation. Additionally, the vendor did not issue certified mail to violators as required, creating a delay in issuance of owner notification letters. The vendor acknowledged the violations and issued refunds to the citizens that were overcharged.

#### A-1 Redland Economy Towing

MDPD issued a warning to the vendor for overcharging citizens for The overcharges totaled \$127.00. The vendor citations issued. acknowledged the violations and issued refunds to the citizens that were overcharged.
