RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO RESEARCH ALTERNATIVE FIREFIGHTER STAFFING MODELS AND PRESENT FINDINGS TO THE BOARD WITHIN SIXTY (60) DAYS

WHEREAS, the Miami-Dade County Fire Rescue Department ("Department") is a world class emergency response organization, internationally recognized for its ability to handle a myriad of life threatening situations; and

WHEREAS, the Department employs 2,359 sworn personnel to protect Miami-Dade County's residential population of nearly 2.5 million residents; and

WHEREAS, to accomplish its mission the Department assigns first line firefighters and paramedics to work twenty-four (24) hour tours of duty and forty eight (48) hour work weeks; and

WHEREAS, twenty-four (24) hour tours of duty can make filling first line firefighter and paramedic vacancies due to illness or unanticipated absence especially costly; and

WHEREAS, the Department spent \$14,695,000 in FY 2012-2013 in overtime; and

WHEREAS, the ten (10) hour shift, also known as the 10/14 duty schedule, has been studied by fire rescue agencies of varying sizes to evaluate its effectiveness in combating duty fatigue while reducing overtime related expenditures; and

WHEREAS, in 2010, the San Jose, California Fire Department implemented an on-duty "overtime" pool to reduce staffing costs by redeploying on-duty personnel to fill operational vacancies that arise due to illness or vacation; and

WHEREAS, the Board is interested in finding efficiencies that can ease the budgetary strain on the Department,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that the County Mayor or Mayor's designee, is directed to study alternatives to the twenty-four hour (24) duty firefighter/paramedic duty schedule and evaluate the feasibility of implementing an alternative work schedule. The review should also evaluate the fiscal impact and/or savings which will be realized through implementation of the alternative work schedule. The Mayor is further charged with examining the implementation of an on-duty overtime pool for use in mitigating overtime expenses incurred by the Department. Lastly, the report should evaluate these options in the context of the current collective bargaining agreement and the need to negotiate changes to the current collective bargaining agreement to implement the options identified in the report. Said report shall be furnished to the Board no later than sixty days (60) from adoption of this resolution.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Esteban L. Bovo, Jr. It was offered by Commissioner , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
