RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE MONTH OF APRIL, 2014 AS SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY; RECOGNIZING THE MONTH OF APRIL EACH YEAR THEREAFTER AS SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH INMIAMI-DADE COUNTY: DIRECTING THE MAYOR OR DESIGNEE TO PREPARE A PLAN FOR A PUBLIC INFORMATION AND EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES, CAMPAIGN, INCLUDING EVENTS AND DURING SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH

WHEREAS, sexual violence is a very serious public health problem that affects millions of women and men; and

WHEREAS, sexual assault is a term that is used to encompass the multitude of ways in which a person can be violated in a sexual nature against her/his will, and is often defined as any sexual act directed against another person, that is forcible and/or against that person's will, or where that person is incapable of giving consent; and

WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, one in five women and one in 71 men living in the United States have been raped in their lifetime; and

WHEREAS, April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month in the United States; and

WHEREAS, sexual violence has also been used as a weapon of war in nearly every recent major conflict; and

WHEREAS, 122 countries recently endorsed the United Nations' historic Declaration of Commitment to End Sexual Violence in Conflict; and

WHEREAS, the Miami Herald and El Nuevo Herald recently published an op-ed piece by William Hague, the United Kingdom's Foreign Secretary and Angelina Jolie, Special Envoy of the United Nations' Commissioner for Refugees, detailing both examples of sexual violence used as a weapon of war, and the international efforts to eradicate it; and

WHEREAS, the United Kingdom has launched the Preventing Sexual Violence Initiative, an international campaign calling for concerted action to address the use of sexual violence as a weapon of war; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to support these efforts and draw public attention to the problem of sexual violence used as a weapon of war; and

WHEREAS, in Miami-Dade County, this Board wishes to raise awareness of sexual violence, help educate the public about prevention, and show support of survivors during Sexual Assault Awareness Month; and

WHEREAS, in Miami-Dade County, victims of sexual assault can turn to a trusted sanctuary for help, the Roxcy Bolton Rape Treatment Center, which is turning 40 this year, thus making April 2014 more special for Miami-Dade County residents, and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to encourage the wearing of the color teal and teal ribbons during the month of April, as these represent awareness of sexual violence, and are often used to commemorate Sexual Assault Awareness Month; and

WHEREAS, to promote awareness of these issues, and to applaud the efforts of those working to put an end to sexual violence in Miami-Dade County and across the world, this Board would like to recognize the month of April, 2014 as Sexual Assault Awareness Month in Miami-Dade County,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Recognizes the month of April, 2014 as Sexual Assault Awareness Month in Miami-Dade County and further recognizes the month of April every year thereafter as Sexual Assault Awareness Month in Miami-Dade County.

Section 2. Directs the Mayor or designee to conduct in conjunction with community partners a public information and educational campaign, including events and activities, for Sexual Assault Awareness Month in Miami-Dade County the Month of April, 2014, as well as the month of April each year thereafter.

Section 3. Directs the Mayor or designee to provide a report to the Board by November 1, 2014 on a plan for a public information and educational campaign, including events and activities, for Sexual Assault Awareness Month each April thereafter.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Chairwoman Rebeca Sosa. It was offered by Commissioner , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
