RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO NEGOTIATE CONTRACT WITH REDSPEED GEORGIA, LLC ACCESSING COMPETITIVELY SOLICITED CONTRACT BETWEEN CITY OF ALPHARETTA, GEORGIA AND REDSPEED GEORGIA, LLC FOR THE ACQUISITION OF AN AUTOMATED SCHOOL ZONE SPEED DETECTION AND ENFORCEMENT SYSTEM; AND DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO RETURN CONTRACT AWARD OR PROVIDE REPORT TO BOARD WITHIN 30 DAYS

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature passed CS/CS/HB 657 during the 2023 Legislative Session, amending certain provisions of State law governing the use of automated speed detection and enforcement systems in school zones; and

WHEREAS, CS/CS/HB 657 became law on June 1, 2023, resulting in Law of Florida 2023-174 taking effect on July 1, 2023 and codified at sections 316.003, 316.008, 316.0776 and 316.1896 et seq., Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, simultaneous with the adoption of this resolution, the Board is enacting an ordinance, consistent with the provisions of CS/CS/HB 657, implementing an automated speed detection and enforcement system in school zones to reduce speeding and benefit public safety, particularly, the safety of a precious County resource, our children; and

WHEREAS, to expeditiously implement an automated school zone speed detection and enforcement system in Miami-Dade County school zones, the County will need to enter a contract with a vendor who can preferably provide a turnkey solution for the installation and operations of a speed detection and enforcement system at school zones; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Implementing Order 3-38, section 3.2.1 of the Miami-Dade County Procurement Guidance Document and Best Practices Manual, and applicable Florida law, Miami-Dade County may competitively award a contract by accessing (aka "piggybacking") the competitively solicited contract of any other governmental entity; and

WHEREAS, the City of Alpharetta, Georgia awarded a contract pursuant to a competitive Request for Proposals (RFP) to RedSpeed Georgia, LLC ("RedSpeed") for a turnkey installation and operations of an automated speed detection and enforcement system at school zones; and

WHEREAS, to expeditiously implement the automated speed detection and enforcement system adopted via ordinance, this Board desires to enter into a contract with RedSpeed accessing the terms and conditions of RedSpeed's competitively procured contract with the City of Alpharetta, Georgia,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are approved and incorporated herein.

Section 2. This Board directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to negotiate a contract with RedSpeed Georgia, LLC for a turnkey installation and operations of an automated speed detection and enforcement system at school zones which accesses the terms and conditions of the competitively awarded contract between the City of Alpharetta, Georgia and RedSpeed. Within 30 days of the effective date of this resolution, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee shall prepare an item for placement on a Board agenda awarding a contract to RedSpeed.

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Section 3. In the event the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee cannot finalize a contract award to RedSpeed within the time period set forth in section 2, then the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee shall provide a report to this Board within 30 days of the effective date of this resolution disclosing the reasons why no contract award has been finalized and place the completed report on an agenda of the full Board without committee review pursuant to rule 5.06(j) of the Board's Rules of Procedure.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Vice Chairman Anthony Rodríguez.
