#### I. Welcome/Introductions:

**a.** Chairman Juan A. Crespi called the Architecture and Engineering (A&E) Advisory Board meeting to order at 10:30 AM. Ms. Sandra Petithomme (SBD) conducted the roll call with five (5) Advisory Board members were present.

#### II. Old Business

#### a. Approval /Modification of Agenda

Ms. Deborah Swain moved to add New Business - Errors and Omissions to A&E Contracts. It was seconded by Ms. Tansel . The motion passed by a vote of 5-0.

#### b. Approval of January 31, 2024 - Meeting Minutes

It was moved by Mr. Brett Moss to approve the January 31, 2024, meeting minutes. This motion was seconded by Ms. Deborah Swain. The motion passed by a vote of 5-0.

#### III. SBD Section Reports

#### a. Director Gary T. Hartfield

Mr. Gary T. Hartfield, the Director of the Office of Small Business Development, briefed the board members on Senate Bill (SB) 742. He mentioned the bill had received unanimous approval from the Florida Senate. Mr. Hartfield indicated that the Senate had adopted the amended language proposed for SB 742. He informed the board members that the next step would involve the governor signing the bill into law. Mr. Hartfield emphasized that once the bill is signed, as of July 1, 2024, the County would no longer be able to enforce responsible wages and workforce measures as stipulated in the approved bills bv the Florida House and Senate.

Mr. Hartfield further explained that this bill would prohibit all Florida Counties from regulating contracts involving privately funded projects.

Additionally, Mr. Hartfield indicated that he had a discussion with the county attorney to gain insight into the potential impact on existing contracts with provisions for responsible wages, workforce measures, and Small Business Enterprise (SBE) participation. He noted that these contracts would likely remain in effect as initially agreed upon, since the legislation does not apply retroactively.

#### b. SBE-A&E Business Outreach and Education Report- Lawanda Wright-Robinson (SBD Section Chief)

i. Mr. Carlos Ansuarez (SBD section Manager) presented the report on behalf of Lawanda Wright-Robinson (SBD Section Chief) for reporting period December 1, 2023 – January 31, 2024. Mr. Carlos informed the board that there was a total of 12 for Certification Assistance; a total of 3 Needs Assessment meetings; 1 Payment Issue; Payment Issues Related to Dollars totaled \$15,695.

## c. SBE- A&E Certification Report – Jeanise Cummings-Labossiere (SBD Section Chief)

i. Ms. Jeanise Cummings-Labossiere presented the report for the period of December 1, 2023 – January 31, 2024. She informed the board that there were 245 certified SBE firms. Ms. Cummings reported to the board that there were 3 new applications received, no firms graduated, and none were denied during this period.

#### d. SBD Utilization Report - Rossi Siewnarine (SBD Section Chief)

- i. Mr. Patrick Hines (SBD) presented the report on behalf of Mr. Rossi Siewnarine (SBD Section Chief) for reporting period December 1, 2023 – January 31, 2024. Mr. Hines reported the total number of contracts awarded, including the demographics during this period was \$7.6 million. He informed the board members that the reporting period for this cycle was short, and only the Equitable Distribution Program (EDP) contract were awarded.
- ii. Mr. Brett Moss requested for future utilization reports to be separated between EDP totals from Architecture and Engineer (A&E). He emphasized s that the board would like to know how much was going into the architectural and engineering sector.
- iii. Mr. Juan Crespi requested data on the regular contracts awarded, set aside, and contracts awarded through the EDP program, focusing on the portion allocated to architects. Mr. Crespi requested a list of both

the firms awarded contracts and the architects and engineers involved in the projects.

- iv. Ms. Ivette Argudin suggested that the board maximize the contracts that have already been awarded.
- v. Ms. Barin Tansel questioned whether an audit process had been conducted for the firms that apply to determine if they were locally headquartered.
- Mrs. Laurie Johnson (SBD Section Chief) informed the board that vi. fulfilling the request to provide contract award information only for architects would need manual examination of all the awards. Ms. Johnson explained that due to Small Business Development (SBD) overseeing three (3) separate programs, the reports were structured to be consistent. She stated that the reports traditionally display the dollar amounts but expressed her willingness to provide the numbers of EDP assignment for any specified period requested by the board. Ms. Johnson explained clarified that the system was designed to identify firms based on technical certifications conducted by the strategic procurement unit. She stated that firms could possess multiple disciplines, with few being exclusively architects or engineers. Ms. Johnson reiterated SBD's commitment to identifying awards based on architectural or engineering services. Additionally, Ms. Johnson clarified that while SBD required firms to provide a tax receipt indicating an office within the county, but SBD does not require firms to be locally headquartered.

#### e. Jackson Health System Report - Kenneth Robertson (JHS)

i. Mr. Kenneth Robertson presented the report for December 1, 2023 – January 31, 2024, noting Eight (8) of sixteen (16) awards for the period were to SBE primes with an overall participation of 28.2%.

#### IV. New Business

#### a. Taskforce Update - Pablo Valin (ISD/Strategic Procurement Division)

i. Mr. Pablo Valin (ISD) informed the board that the revised I-O 3-39 was scheduled to be heard at the for April 8<sup>th</sup> Chairman Policy Council meeting. Mr. Valin noted an amendment to I-O 3-39 was implemented, stating the complicity with Florida State Legislation regarding advertising requirements in either a local newspaper or a website that meet certain criteria.

#### b. Errors and Omissions to A&E Contracts- Ms. Deborah Swain

i. Ms. Swain informed the board that the Department of Water and Sewer was awarding several new contracts, including language in the Errors and Omissions section that bypasses the liability insurance. She raised concerns about SBD's requirement for firms to maintain professional insurance ranging

from \$2 to \$4 million dollars, questioning its significance if it could be bypassed contractually.

## V. Reasonable opportunity for the public to be heard before County Boards (Sec. 2-11.39.3)

**a.** Chairman Crespi opened the reasonable opportunity for the public to be heard; seeing no one come forward to speak, the reasonable opportunity to be heard was closed.

#### VI. Adjournment

**a.** There being no further business to come before the Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Architecture and Engineering Board, Chairman Juan A. Crespi adjourned the meeting at 11:48 am.
