RECOMMENDATION

Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTPW) is forwarding this memorandum to the Miami-Dade County, Small Business Development (SBD) for informational purposes regarding the referenced Federal Transit Administration (FTA), State and local funded project. As a result of DTPW's Office of Civil Rights (OCR) analysis of DTPW's workload based on anticipated projects' scope of work, cost estimate and technical certifications, will establish the goals at a work order level.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

DTPW has the need to establish four (4) non-exclusive Professional Services Agreements (PSA) to provide CEI services required for contract administration and inspection for various DTPW Projects. Services will be in compliance with the applicable federal requirements under the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Circular 4220.1F, FTA's Best Practices Procurement Manual, and Florida Statutes 287.055.

Engineering Construction Management Services will be provided on an as-needed basis for the Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTPW) projects under the capital improvements program. Four (4) consultants will be retained under separate non-exclusive Professional Services Agreements (PSA) providing for a five (5) year effective term with the option of a two (2) year extension if the compensation ceiling is not reached or until the contract amount limits are reached, whichever occurs first. However, no minimum amount of work or compensation will be guaranteed. Funding for these services will be provided by the FTA, and other state and local sources, on a project-by-project basis, and in accordance with negotiated fees and tasks described in each individual service work order.

COST ESTIMATE

The maximum total compensation is set at \$20,000,000.00 plus \$2,000,000.00 for contingency, for a total of 22,000,000.00. No minimum amount of work or compensation will be guaranteed to the selected consultants.

The consultant team must be certified in the technical categories listed below. The Architectural and Engineering section of SPD reviewed the technical certifications and provided concurrence.
